ARTICLES OF ORGANIZATION OF CAMPAIGN DATA SYSTEMS

I, the undersigned natural person, having attained at least the minimum age set forth in Article 3.01 of the Texas Limited Liability Company Act (the "LLCA") and acting as an organizer thereunder of a limited liability company (hereinafter referred to as the "Company"), do hereby adopt the following Articles of Organization of the Company:

ARTICLE I NAME

The name of the Company shall be "CAMPAIGN DATA SYSTEMS", LLC "

ARTICLE II POWERS

The Company shall have all the powers accorded to a limited liability company under the LLCA.

ARTICLE III PURPOSES

The purpose for which the Company is organized is to transact any or all lawful business for which limited liability companies may be organized under the LLCA.

ARTICLE IV DURATION

The Company's period of duration be perpetual.

ARTICLE V REGULATIONS

The initial members of the Company shall adopt the Regulations that shall govern the Regulation and management of the affairs of the Company, provided, however, that the failure to adopt such Regulations prior to the date on which the Secretary of the State of Texas issues a Certificate of Organization shall not affect the Company's commencement of existence on such date. The Regulations shall provide for all the terms and conditions for the Regulation and management of the affairs of the Company not inconsistent with applicable law or with these Articles of Organization. The power to adopt, alter, amend or repeal the Regulations shall be vested in the members of the Company unless vested in whole or part in the managers of the Company by the Regulations.

Unless otherwise provided in these Articles of Organization or regulations, adoption, alteration, amendment, or repeal of the regulations shall require the affirmative vote, approval, or consent of all the members.

ARTICLE VI MANAGERS

The management of the Company is vested in the managers of the Company, except to the extent that the Regulations shall reserve the same, in whole or in part, to the members of the Company. Unless otherwise required by the Regulations, the managers of the Company need not be members of the Company and need not be residents of the State of Texas. Managers shall be elected by the members at the annual meeting of the members. The Regulations may provide that the holders of a particular class of membership interests may be entitled to elect the managers.

The number of initial managers of the Company shall be two (2), and the name and address of each of the initial managers, who shall serve as managers of the Company until the first annual meeting of the members of the Company or until their successors are duly elected and qualified, are set forth below:

ARTICLE VII PRINCIPAL PLACE OF BUSINESS

ARTICLE VIII MEMBERSHIP INTERESTS

The membership interests in the Company shall be defined and established in the Regulations, including the relative rights, powers, and duties, including voting rights, thereof.


ARTICLE IX
INDEMNIFICATION

The Company shall indemnify any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending or completed action, suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative, arbitrative or investigative, any appeal in such an action, suit or proceeding and any inquiry or investigation that could lead to such an action, suit or proceeding (whether or not by or in the right of the Company), by reason of the fact that he or she is or was a member, manager, officer, employee or agent of the Company or is or was serving at the request of the Company as a manager, director, officer, partner, venturer, proprietor, trustee, employee, agent or similar functionary of another limited liability company, corporation, employee benefit plan, other enterprise, or other entity against all judgments, penalties (including excise and similar taxes), fines, settlements and reasonable expenses (including attorneys' fees and court costs) actually and reasonably incurred by him or her in connection with such action, suit or proceeding to the fullest extent permitted by any applicable law, and such indemnity shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors and administrators of any such person so indemnified pursuant to this Article X. The right to indemnification under this Article X shall be a contract right and shall not be deemed exclusive of any other right to which those seeking indemnification may be entitled under the Regulations or any law, agreement, vote of members or disinterested managers or otherwise, both as to action in his or her official capacity and as to action in another capacity while holding such office.



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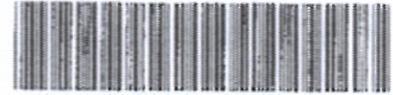

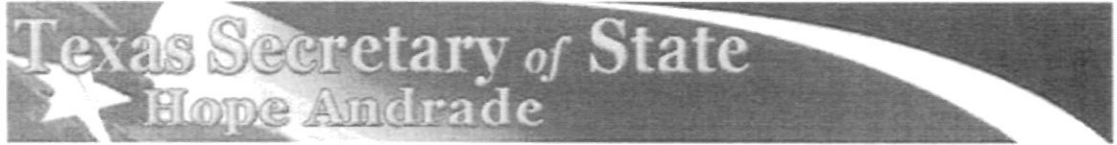

Conflicting roles Harris County voter registrar's second job creates appearance of partisan bias.

Campaign Data Systems is a Houston-based political software company that provides services to elected officials, candidates, and political organizations, mostly of the Republican persuasion.

Founded by Dwayne Bohac, a Houston GOP state rep, the company boasts "an unequalled database of voters along with demographic information unavailable from other data vendors."

One of the company's more valuable assets is a paid director, Ed Johnson, who doubles as the associate voter registrar for the Harris County Tax Assessor-Collector's Office. The firm sells county and state voter data to customers. Johnson is paid with taxpayer dollars to supervise voter registration in a nonpartisan manner.

"We're the business behind winning campaigns," declares the CDS Web site. "Allow us to partner with you and put our expertise to work!"

A Democratic activist group, Lone Star Project, documented more than \$145,000 in payments to the company from GOP candidates since its founding in the mid-'90s. State and local campaign records indicate CDS sold at least \$60,000 in voter data to its candidate clients last year.

Johnson's former boss, Paul Bettencourt, was frequently criticized for using the office to promote his political agenda. The Texas Democratic Party filed a federal lawsuit last year claiming the tax assessor's staff rejected voter applications at a far higher rate than in other counties.

When Bettencourt stepped down weeks after being re-elected last year, Harris County commissioners replaced him with Leo Vasquez, a Republican activist formerly involved in registering Hispanics for the GOP.

Democrat Diane Trautman, who narrowly lost to Bettencourt, called for Johnson's removal before next November's elections. "Vasquez should be responsible for background checks on second forms of employment for his people," noted Trautman. "I just wonder how many other employees there are in the tax office who have the same conflict of interest as Johnson."

Harris County Democratic Party Chairman Gerry Birnberg conjured up a scenario in which former Bush political adviser Karl Rove was hired to head up the county's voter registration department, while continuing to work with GOP candidates. "Would anyone seriously contend that wouldn't stink to high heaven?" asked Birnberg.

In response to such criticism, Vasquez defended his staffer as an honorable man and labeled inferences that Johnson was involved in inappropriate activity "slanderous and absolutely reprehensible."

Given the recent history of his office, perhaps it's not surprising that Vasquez would see nothing amiss in having a staffer responsible for voter registration involved in partisan campaign work on the side.

When the tax assessor stands for re-election next year, voters will have the opportunity to express their own views of such activities. In the meantime, Vasquez should order Johnson to choose between his public and private gigs and eliminate the appearance of a conflict of interest.

THE TEXAS CONSTITUTION ARTICLE 3. LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT

THE TEXAS CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE 3. LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT

Sec. 1. SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. The Legislative power of this State shall be vested in a Senate and House of Representatives, which together shall be styled "The Legislature of the State of Texas."

Sec. 2. MEMBERSHIP OF SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. The Senate shall consist of thirty-one members. The House of Representatives shall consist of 150 members.
(Amended Nov. 2, 1999.) (TEMPORARY TRANSITION PROVISIONS for Sec. 2: See Appendix, Note 1.)

Sec. 3. ELECTION AND TERM OF OFFICE OF SENATORS. The Senators shall be chosen by the qualified voters for the term of four years; but a new Senate shall be chosen after every apportionment, and the Senators elected after each apportionment shall be divided by lot into two classes. The seats of the Senators of the first class shall be vacated at the expiration of the first two years, and those of the second class at the expiration of four years, so that one half of the Senators shall be chosen biennially thereafter. Senators shall take office following their election, on the day set by law for the convening of the Regular Session of the Legislature, and shall serve thereafter for the full term of years to which elected.

(Amended Nov. 8, 1966, and Nov. 2, 1999.) (TEMPORARY TRANSITION PROVISIONS for Sec. 3: See Appendix, Note 1.)

Sec. 4. ELECTION AND TERM OF MEMBERS OF HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. The Members of the House of Representatives shall be chosen by the qualified voters for the term of two years. Representatives shall take office following their election, on the day set by law for the convening of the Regular Session of the Legislature, and shall serve thereafter for the full term of years to which elected.

Sec. 21. WORDS SPOKEN IN DEBATE. No member shall be questioned in any other place for words spoken in debate in either House.

Sec. 22. DISCLOSURE OF PRIVATE INTEREST IN MEASURE OR BILL; NOT TO VOTE. A member who has a personal or private interest in any measure or bill, proposed, or pending before the Legislature, shall disclose the fact to the House, of which he is a member, and shall not vote thereon.

Sec. 23. REMOVAL FROM DISTRICT OR COUNTY FROM WHICH ELECTED. If any Senator or Representative remove his residence from the district or county for which he was elected, his office shall thereby become vacant, and the vacancy shall be filled as provided in section 13 of this article.

Sec. 23a. (Repealed Nov. 4, 1997.)

Sec. 24. COMPENSATION AND EXPENSES OF MEMBERS OF LEGISLATURE; DURATION OF SESSIONS. (a) Members of the Legislature shall receive from the Public Treasury a salary of Six Hundred Dollars (\$600) per month, unless a greater amount is recommended by the Texas Ethics Commission and approved by the voters of this State in which case the salary is that amount. Each member shall also receive a per diem set by the Texas Ethics Commission for each day during each Regular and Special Session of the Legislature.

(b) No Regular Session shall be of longer duration than one hundred and forty (140) days.

(c) In addition to the per diem the Members of each House shall be entitled to mileage at the same rate as prescribed by law for employees of the State of Texas.

AUTHOR'S/SPONSOR'S STATEMENT OF INTENT

Current Texas law sets forth requirements for a voter registration application. The existing application provides only one box for providing driver's license number, personal identification card number, or the last four digits of a social security number. It is difficult for voter registrars to electronically scan the application into their systems because these numbers are placed in the same box, and the computers do not know which number has been provided on the application. Likewise, a statement indicates that providing false information could result in a penalty, but this statement does not convey the weight of the penalty if convicted. There is also no way for the applicant to inform election officials of an interest in becoming a poll worker. Other states' registration applications include this information in their design.

H.B. 1268 modifies provisions relating to information included on a voter registration application to improve the registration process and the recruitment of election workers.

RULEMAKING AUTHORITY

This bill does not expressly grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, institution, or agency.

SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS

SECTION 1. Amends Section 13.002(c), Election Code, to require a voter registration application to include specific information.

SECTION 2. Amends Section 13.004(c), Election Code, as follows:

(c) Provides that a social security number, Texas driver's license number, number of a personal identification card issued by the Department of Public Safety, or an indication that an applicant is interested in working as an election judge furnished on a registration application is confidential and does not constitute public information for purposes of Chapter 552 (Public Information), Government Code. Requires the voter registrar to ensure that a social security number, Texas driver's license number, number of a personal identification card issued by DPS, or an indication that an applicant is interested in working as an election judge is excluded from disclosure.

SECTION 3. Amends Section 13.122(a), Election Code, to require each official form, in addition to the other statements and spaces for entering information that appear on an officially prescribed registration application form, to include specific information.

SECTION 4. Makes application of this Act prospective.

SECTION 5. Effective date: January 1, 2006.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 13.002(c), Election Code, is amended to read as follows:

Dems protest official's side job Associate registrar also works for group selling voter data to Republicans johnson: Office knew of worker's other job

A high-ranking employee in Harris County's voter registration office also moonlights for a company that sold at least nearly \$60,000 worth of information on those voters to Republican candidates during the last election cycle, records show, angering Democratic activists.

Ed Johnson is associate voter registrar at the Harris County Tax Assessor-Collector's Office, where he's worked since 1999. He's also a paid director for Computer Data Systems, a venture started in 2003 with state Rep. Dwayne Bohac, R-Houston. The company sells the same voter information Johnson is paid by taxpayers to manage in a nonpolitical manner.

"No question this doesn't smell," said Harold Cook, a Democratic political consultant in Austin. "It's a government official who has duties involving the election process who is a political consultant who has clients who are on the same ballots he is handling."

Neither Johnson nor Bohac returned calls for comment.

According to a recently dismantled Web site, CDS sells voter data to Republican candidates. No records indicating information was sold to Democrats could be found. Secretary of state records show Bohac as the registered agent and Johnson as a director. Johnson's party affiliation was not known on Wednesday, but he is known in political circles as a Republican consultant.

Complaints dismissed

Leo Vasquez, Harris County tax assessor-collector and voter registrar, issued a statement that dismissed complaints that Johnson's job, which can include approving or rejecting voter applications, conflicts with his side business.

"Ed Johnson is an honorable man," Vasquez said. "It is slanderous and absolutely reprehensible to suggest without evidence that he is involved in inappropriate activity with regard to voter registration in Harris County."

Vasquez's spokesman, Fred King, said Johnson has been in this type of business since the mid-1990s, so his involvement in voter registration data was no secret.

"His knowledge of compiling lists and his programming expertise are the reasons Paul Bettencourt

(Vasquez's predecessor) hired him," King said. "Vasquez may have heard of Ed's outside business before taking office since many candidates and campaign workers knew of it."

Rejection rates

Last year, the Texas Democratic Party charged in a federal lawsuit that the Tax Assessor-Collector's Office is rejecting voter applications at a much higher rate than any other Texas county elections office.

"Harris County had 70,000 voter registration applications rejected," said Texas Democratic Party attorney Chad Dunn. "That's exponentially higher than anywhere else in the state."

Dunn said Dallas County rejected 1,800 for the same period, January 2006 through October 2008.

The two consultants also said they are concerned that Johnson's role in the approval of provisional ballots may be tainted.

When voters show up at a polling place without their driver's licenses or voter registration cards, but have proof of their addresses and insist they are registered to vote, they are asked to fill out provisional ballots. In close elections, provisional ballots are used. This past election, there were several close races in Harris County.

Cook said that while Johnson may not get the final say in deciding whether provisional ballots are used, "his office is one of the stops for provisional ballots."

Thousands of dollars

State and local campaign records show that CDS sold at least \$60,000 worth of information on Harris County voters in 2008.

The Lone Star Project, a Democratic advocacy group, said campaign records from 2003 to the present show at least \$145,000 was paid to Republican candidates who use the information for targeted campaign strategies.

Harris County District Attorney Pat Lykos' campaign paid more than \$7,000 last year to CDS. She said late Wednesday her campaign hired CDS for targeted campaign mailers but she did not know about Johnson's job with the county.

She insisted she saw no compromise of the elections office's mission.

"I saw no conflict," Lykos said.

730.013,

Sec. 730.013. RESALE OR REDISCLOSURE. (a) An authorized recipient of personal information may not resell or redisclose the personal information in the identical or a substantially identical format the personal information was disclosed to the recipient by the applicable agency.

(b) An authorized recipient of personal information may resell or redisclose the information only for a use permitted under Section 730.007.

(c) Any authorized recipient who resells or rediscloses personal information obtained from an agency shall be required by that agency to:

(1) maintain for a period of not less than five years records as to any person or entity receiving that information and the permitted use for which it was obtained; and

(2) provide copies of those records to the agency on request.

(d) A person commits an offense if the person violates this section. An offense under this subsection is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed \$25,000.

Sec. 730.007. PERMITTED DISCLOSURES. (a) Personal information obtained by an agency in connection with a motor vehicle record may be disclosed to any requestor by an agency if the requestor:

(1) provides the requestor's name and address and any proof of that information required by the agency; and

(2) represents that the use of the personal information will be strictly limited to:

(A) use by:

(i) a government agency, including any court or law enforcement agency, in carrying out its functions; or

(ii) a private person or entity acting on behalf of a government agency in carrying out the functions of the agency;

(B) use in connection with a matter of:

(i) motor vehicle or motor vehicle operator safety;

(ii) motor vehicle theft;

(iii) motor vehicle product alterations, recalls, or advisories;

(iv) performance monitoring of motor vehicles, motor vehicle parts, or motor vehicle dealers;

(v) motor vehicle market research activities, including survey research; or

(vi) removal of nonowner records from the original owner records of motor vehicle manufacturers;

(C) use in the normal course of business by a legitimate business or an authorized agent of the business, but only:

(i) to verify the accuracy of personal information submitted by the individual to the business or the agent of the business; and

(ii) if the information is not correct, to obtain the correct information, for the sole purpose of preventing fraud by, pursuing a legal remedy against, or recovering on a debt or security interest against the individual;

(D) use in conjunction with a civil, criminal, administrative, or arbitral proceeding in any court or government agency or before any self-regulatory body, including service of process, investigation in anticipation of litigation, execution or enforcement of a judgment or order, or under an order of any court;

(E) use in research or in producing statistical reports, but only if the personal information is not published, redisclosed, or used to contact any individual;

(F) use by an insurer or insurance support organization, or by a self-insured entity, or an authorized agent of the entity, in connection with claims investigation activities, antifraud activities, rating, or underwriting;

(G) use in providing notice to an owner of a towed or impounded vehicle;

(H) use by a licensed private investigator agency or licensed security service for a purpose permitted under this section;

(I) use by an employer or an agent or insurer of the employer to obtain or verify information relating to a holder of a commercial driver's license that is required under 49 U.S.C. Chapter 313;

(J) use in connection with the operation of a private toll transportation facility;

(K) use by a consumer reporting agency, as defined by the Fair Credit Reporting Act (15 U.S.C. Section 1681 et seq.), for a purpose permitted under that Act; or

(L) use for any other purpose specifically authorized by law that relates to the operation of a motor vehicle or to public safety.

(b) The only personal information an agency may release under this section is the individual's:

- (1) name and address;
- (2) date of birth; and
- (3) driver's license number.

(c) This section does not:

(1) prohibit the disclosure of a person's photographic image to:

(A) a law enforcement agency or a criminal justice agency for an official purpose; or

(B) an agency of this state investigating an alleged violation of a state or federal law relating to the obtaining, selling, or purchasing of a benefit authorized by Chapter 31 or 33, Human Resources Code; or

(2) prevent a court from compelling by subpoena the production of a person's photographic image.

(d) Personal information obtained by an agency in connection with a motor vehicle record shall be disclosed to a requestor by an agency if the requestor:

(1) provides the requestor's name and address and any proof of that information required by the agency; and

(2) represents that the intent of the requestor is to use personal information in the motor vehicle record only for the purpose of preventing, detecting, or protecting against personal identity theft or other acts of fraud and provides any proof of the requestor's intent required by the agency.

(e) If the agency determines that the requestor intends to use personal information requested under Subsection (d) only for the represented purpose, the agency shall release to the requestor any requested personal information in the motor vehicle record.

(f) Personal information obtained by an agency under Section 411.0845, Government Code, in connection with a motor vehicle record may be disclosed as provided by that section.

Drivers Privacy Protection Act
18 U.S.C. § 2721 et. seq.
(Public Law 103-322)

Section 2721. Prohibition on release and use of certain personal information from State motor vehicle records

(a) In General -- Except as provided in subsection (b), a State department of motorvehicles, and any officer, employee, or contractor, thereof, shall not knowingly disclose or otherwise make available to any person or entity personal information about any individual obtained by the department in connection with a motor vehicle record.

(b) Permissible Uses -- Personal information referred to in subsection (a) shall be disclosed for use in connection with matters of motor vehicle or driver safety and theft, motorvehicle emissions, motor vehicle product alterations, recalls, or advisories, performance monitoring of

motor vehicles and dealers by motor vehicle manufacturers, and removal of non-owner records from the original owner records of motor vehicle manufacturers to carry out the purposes of the *Automobile Information Disclosure Act*, the *Motor Vehicle Information and Cost Saving Act*, the *National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act of 1966*, the *Anti-Car Theft Act of 1992*, and the *Clean Air Act*, and may be disclosed as follows:

(1) For use by any government agency, including any court or law enforcement agency, in carrying out its functions, or any private person or entity acting on behalf of a Federal, State, or local agency in carrying out its functions.

(2) For use in connection with matters of motor vehicle or driver safety and theft; motor vehicle emissions; motor vehicle product alterations, recalls, or advisories; performance monitoring of motor vehicles, motor vehicle parts and dealers; motor vehicle market research activities, including survey research; and removal of non-owner records from the original owner records of motor vehicle manufacturers.

(3) For use in the normal course of business by a legitimate business or its agents, employees, or contractors, but only --

(A) to verify the accuracy of personal information submitted by the individual to the business or its agents, employees, or contractors; and

(B) if such information as so submitted is not correct or is no longer correct, to obtain the correct information, but only for the purposes of preventing fraud by, pursuing legal remedies against, or recovering on a debt or security interest against, the individual.

(4) For use in connection with any civil, criminal, administrative, or arbitral proceeding in any Federal, State, or local court or agency or before any self-regulatory body, including the service of process, investigation in anticipation of litigation, and the execution or enforcement of judgments and orders, or pursuant to an order of a Federal, State, or local court.

(5) For use in research activities, and for use in producing statistical reports, so long as the personal information is not published, redisclosed, or used to contact individuals.

(6) For use by any insurer or insurance support organization, or by a self-insured entity, or its agents, employees, or contractors, in connection with claims investigation activities, anti-fraud activities, rating or underwriting.

(7) For use in providing notice to the owners of towed or impounded vehicles.

(8) For use by any licensed private investigative agency or licensed security service for any purpose permitted under this subsection.

(9) For use by an employer or its agents or insurer to obtain or verify information relating to a holder of a commercial driver's license that is required under the *Commercial Motor Vehicle Safety Act of 1986* (49 U.S.C. App. 2710 et seq.).

(10) For use in connection with the operation of private toll transportation facilities.

(11) For any other use in response to requests for individual motor vehicle records if the motor vehicle department has provided in a clear and conspicuous manner on forms for issuance or renewal of operator's permits, titles, registrations, or identification cards, notice that personal information collected by the department may be disclosed to any business or person, and has provided in a clear and conspicuous manner on such forms an opportunity to prohibit such disclosures.

(12) For bulk distribution for surveys, marketing or solicitations if the motor vehicle department has implemented methods and procedures to ensure that --

(A) individuals are provided an opportunity, in a clear and conspicuous manner, to prohibit such uses; and

(B) the information will be used, rented, or sold solely for bulk distribution for surveys, marketing, and solicitations, and that surveys, marketing, and solicitations will not be directed at those individuals who have requested in a timely fashion that they not be directed at them.

(13) For use by any requester, if the requester demonstrates it has obtained the written consent of the individual to whom the information pertains.

(14) For any other use specifically authorized under the law of the State that holds the record, if such use is related to the operation of a motor vehicle or public safety.

(c) Resale or Redislosure -- An authorized recipient of personal information (except a recipient under subsection (b)(11) or (12)) may resell or disclose the information only for a use permitted under subsection (b) (but not for uses under subsection (b)(11) or (12)). An authorized recipient under subsection (b)(11) may resell or disclose personal information for any purpose. An authorized recipient under subsection (b)(12) may resell or disclose personal information pursuant to subsection (b)(12). Any authorized recipient (except a recipient under subsection (b)(11)) that resells or discloses personal information covered by this title must keep for a period of 5 years records identifying each person or entity that receives information and the permitted purpose for which the information will be used and must make such records available to the motor vehicle department upon request.

(d) Waiver Procedures -- A State motor vehicle department may establish and carry out procedures under which the department or its agents, upon receiving a request for personal information that does not fall within one of the exceptions in subsection (b), may mail a copy of the request to the individual about whom the information was requested, informing such individual of the request, together with a statement to the effect that the information will not be released unless the individual waives such individual's right to privacy under this section.

Section 2722. Additional unlawful acts

(a) Procurement for Unlawful Purpose -- It shall be unlawful for any person knowingly to obtain or disclose personal information, from a motor vehicle record, for any use not permitted under section 2721(b) of this title.

(b) False Representation -- It shall be unlawful for any person to make false representation to obtain any personal information from an individual's motor vehicle record.

Section 2723. Penalties

(a) Criminal Fine -- A person who knowingly violates this chapter shall be fined under this title.

(b) Violations by State Department of Motor Vehicles -- Any State department of motor vehicles that has a policy or practice of substantial noncompliance with this chapter shall be subject to a civil penalty imposed by the Attorney General of not more than \$5,000 a day for each day of substantial noncompliance.

Section 2724. Civil action

(a) Cause of Action -- A person who knowingly obtains, discloses or uses personal information, from a motor vehicle record, for a purpose not permitted under this chapter shall be liable to the individual to whom the information pertains, who may bring a civil action in a United States district court.

(b) Remedies -- The court may award --

(1) actual damages, but not less than liquidated damages in the amount of \$2,500;

(2) punitive damages upon proof of willful or reckless disregard of the law;

(3) reasonable attorneys' fees and other litigation costs reasonably incurred; and

(4) such other preliminary and equitable relief as the court determines to be appropriate.

Section 2725. Definitions

In this chapter --

(1) "motor vehicle record" means any record that pertains to a motor vehicle operator's permit, motor vehicle title, motor vehicle registration, or identification card issued by a department of motor vehicles;

(2) "person" means an individual, organization or entity, but does not include a State or agency thereof; and

(3) "personal information" means information that identifies an individual, including an individual's photograph, social security number, driver identification number, name, address (but

not the 5-digit zip code), telephone number, and medical or disability information, but does not include information on vehicular accidents, driving violations, and driver's status.

WHEREAS, Texas law authorizes DPS to sell driver and related records individually and in bulk for specified permissible purposes; and

WHEREAS, state and federal law, including the federal Driver Privacy Protection Act of 1994 (PL 103-322; 18 USC § 2721 et seq.) and Texas' driver privacy protection legislation of 1995 (Tex. Trans. Code §730) extend privacy protection to personal information maintained in the files of the state motor vehicle agencies such as the Texas DPS; and

WHEREAS, the Driver Privacy Protection Act of 1994, as amended by PL 106-69 (18 USC §2721, as amended), presently prohibits state motor vehicle agencies from selling personal information in bulk for purposes of marketing, solicitations, and certain surveys unless a state has first obtained express consent from each individual about whom listed personal information pertains; and

WHEREAS, the Texas State Legislature has refrained from enacting any express consent system for use in Texas; and

WHEREAS, Texas law requires each prospective purchaser of records in bulk, before receiving any records, to execute a written purchase agreement or contract containing such safeguards as DPS considers necessary or reasonable to ensure that all information and records purchased are used only for permissible purposes and that the rights of the individuals and DPS are protected; and

WHEREAS, the Purchaser, desires to purchase driver or related records, including personal information, from DPS,

IT IS AGREED, THEREFORE, that DPS shall sell and deliver to the Purchaser the driver records, subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. Definitions

- b. "Personal information" means information that identifies a person, including the driver identification number, name, date of birth, and address.

2. Certification of Permissible Use(s).

The Purchaser, by signing this agreement, hereby certifies compliance with all current provisions of the federal Driver Privacy Protection Act of 1994, as amended by PL 106-69 (18 USC §2721 et seq.), with applicable Texas driver privacy protection legislation, and with all other state and federal laws applicable to this agreement. The Purchaser further certifies that his/her/its use of the record and information purchased under this contract is for the following permissible purpose(s) only and for no others:

It is expressly understood that the Purchaser may sell or furnish personal information obtained under this agreement to third parties, subject to the limitations herein, but may not sell or furnish personal information for any purpose or use that is not permitted by federal or state law. The Purchaser understands that he/she/it may not furnish personal information purchased under this agreement to any third party unless the third party certifies that his/her/its intended use of the information is for a use permitted under this contract and state and federal law. In addition the Purchaser

agrees to the statutory restrictions on selling and/or redisclosing the information obtained from DPS. The Purchaser shall not sell or redisclose the personal information in the identical or substantially identical format the information was disclosed to the Purchaser. The Purchaser further understands that violating this paragraph is grounds for immediate termination of this agreement under Paragraph 13.

3. Fees and Payments.

In consideration of receiving records and information purchased in bulk, the Purchaser agrees to pay to DPS the applicable statutory charge. At DPS request, the Purchaser shall pay to DPS, prior to transmittal of the records and information in bulk, a deposit in an amount determined by DPS to be the approximate charge and shall pay any balance due upon receipt of billing. If this method of payment is requested, DPS shall refund any overpayment, pursuant to state procedures, following delivery of the copies. If DPS does not request a deposit, the Purchaser shall remit payment immediately upon receipt of billing but shall not be considered in default for a period of thirty (30) days following receipt of billing. The Purchaser acknowledges and agrees that all postage and/or other shipping charges, as well as shipping media (e.g. magnetic tapes) shall be the Purchaser's responsibility and may be included in the billing.

4. Acknowledgement and Disclaimer.

The Purchaser acknowledges that DPS is furnishing records and information "as is" and it makes no representation or warranty as to the accuracy of any record or the information furnished. If records and information are not furnished and the Purchaser has remitted a deposit, DPS shall refund the deposit. DPS has no further responsibility or liability to the Purchaser with respect to undelivered records and information and has no liability or responsibility whatsoever for delayed records and information.

5. Consumer Protection.

Purchaser shall bear the expense of providing the copies of such records to DPS including any postage and/or shipping charges. The Purchaser will notify DPS of any inadvertent or unauthorized release of the Driver Record Information obtained under this contract within two days of when the Purchaser knows or should have known of such unauthorized or inadvertent release.

9. Assignability.

The Purchaser may not assign, license, or transfer any of its rights, duties, and obligations under this agreement without the prior written consent of DPS.

10. Incorporation of Other Documents.

This agreement incorporates by reference the document entitled the Purchaser's Information Form Attachment A to the Agreement for Purchasing Driver Record Information in Bulk, which provides DPS additional information about the Purchaser. With the exception to Attachment A, this agreement embodies the entire agreement between the Purchaser and DPS with relation to the transaction contemplated hereby, and there have been and are no other covenants, agreements, representations, warranties or restrictions between the parties other than those specifically set forth in the agreement.

11. Effective Date and Renewal.

This contract shall automatically renew on a yearly basis. However, either party may terminate this agreement upon thirty days written notice to the other party. Notice should be given to the contact person designated in Paragraph 17 of this contract. Notice is effective upon receipt or three days after deposit in the U. S. mail, whichever occurs first.

12. Cancellation.

Either party may cancel this agreement for any reason by giving the other party written notice of cancellation at least thirty (30) days prior to cancellation. If a party elects to cancel this agreement, all unfilled obligations, including the obligation to pay for copies received, shall remain in force.

13. Termination.

DPS may terminate this agreement in writing at any time for any reason. Without limiting the foregoing, DPS may immediately terminate this agreement, without notice for any violation of the terms of this contract or for any violation of any state or federal law or regulation relating to the information provided by DPS under this agreement. This includes but is not limited to failure to remit charges due in a timely fashion or for inappropriate use of data, such as use for marketing or solicitations. The Purchaser acknowledges that if this agreement is terminated for cause, DPS may refuse to provide records and information in bulk.

14. Change of Status.

The Purchaser may terminate this contract in writing at any time. This agreement will automatically terminate if the Purchaser ceases to conduct business, if the Purchaser substantially changes the nature of its business, if the Purchaser sells its business, if there is a significant change in the ownership of the Purchaser, if the Purchaser ceases to qualify for the information under the permissible use(s) certified in Paragraph 2, or if the Purchaser dies. The Purchaser, its successor in interest, or its personal representative will immediately notify DPS in writing of any change in status that would implicate this paragraph. If the contract is terminated under this paragraph, the Purchaser's successor in interest will be eligible to apply for and execute a new contract.

15. Amendments.

The Purchaser acknowledges that DPS may amend the terms and conditions of this agreement from time to time in order to accommodate changes in the records or information furnished under this agreement and for other reasons deemed appropriate by DPS. DPS agrees to notify the Purchaser in writing of the content of any amendment. The Purchaser can make no modification or amendment to this Agreement unless in writing and signed by both parties.

16. Indemnification.

The Purchaser agrees to indemnify and save harmless the State of Texas and DPS, and any of their officers, agents, or employees, with respect to any claim asserted against them under the federal Driver Privacy Protection Act of 1994, as amended (18 USC §2721 et seq.), Texas driver privacy protection legislation (Tex Trans Code §730, as amended), and other state or federal law pertaining to this agreement, for any act or omission attributable to the Purchaser, its officer, agents, and employees, and others who obtain information from the Purchaser.

ELECTION 2008; Ballot results today may alter 2 outcomes; Judges' contests at stake; neither party happy with county registrar

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Final vote totals that could reverse outcomes in two Nov. 4 Harris County judicial elections will be unveiled today, election supervisors said, after a controversial counting process that left Republican and Democratic officials unhappy.

A bipartisan board that has been checking thousands of leftover ballots planned to be finished by midnight Wednesday.

About 1,400 ballots will qualify, officials estimated, and be added to last week's election totals after the county clerk's office reopens today.

If the ballots contain votes on judicial elections, they could reverse the outcomes in two contests where fewer than 600 votes separated the winners and losers as of last week.

No other county races had margins of victory smaller than 1,400 votes.

Democratic candidate Goodwille Pierre, who trailed Republican state District Judge Joseph "Tad" Halbach by fewer than 600 votes, said he had faith the new totals will make him a new judge. "I believe it will definitely show that we are ahead," he said.

In the other closest race, Republican state District Judge Elizabeth Ray trailed Democratic challenger Josefina Muniz Rendon by 135 votes.

Provisional votes

The vote-counting work lurched forward when county voter registrar Paul Bettencourt delivered his reports on about 7,000 so-called provisional ballots that were cast by people not listed on the Election Day voter rolls.

Some of those residents had been omitted from registration records by mistake and under federal law were allowed to vote after swearing on special forms that they were registered. Their votes will added to the totals if their registrations are confirmed.

But Republican Jim Harding, a retired Houston business executive who chairs the ballot board of about 35 people, said the counting process was delayed by faulty work by Bettencourt's staff.

The problems included hundreds of voter forms whose information the registrar's staff masked with white correction fluid and then altered with new information, Harding said.

As ballot board members determined whether ballots should be counted, he said, they wanted to have confidence in the accuracy of the registrar's research.

But "that kind of confidence is not replicated here, and then when they see this 'white-out' all over the place they get nervous," he said.

Errors and claims

Also, the board has accepted ballots cast by voters whose registrations had been classified by Bettencourt's staff as incomplete, Harding said. In many cases records showed voters had visited state Department of Public Safety offices where they claimed to have registered to vote, Harding explained, and the ballot board is giving those voters the benefit of the doubt.

Harding said there were more errors and related voting records problems than in five previous elections in which he served on the ballot board.

Still, most of the 7,000 or so provisional ballots were being rejected - because, among other reasons, voters' registration had expired, they had moved out of Harris County or they are parolees.

Bettencourt could not be reached for comment late Wednesday after Harding made his comments.

Foot-dragging alleged

Earlier in the day, Texas Democratic Party officials dropped their request for a judge to order Bettencourt to complete the tallies and open his staff's work to monitors. However, Democrats said they will press ahead next year with the part of their lawsuit that accuses Bettencourt, a Republican, of illegally rejecting voter registrations applications.

After a court hearing on the Democrats' lawsuit, their lawyer, Chad Dunn, implied that Bettencourt had dragged his feet on processing the provisional ballots as the deadline for counting them neared.

"We are disappointed ... that it took a lawsuit to get Mr. Bettencourt to do his job," he said.

Bettencourt said he already had been doing the work in a timely fashion before the lawsuit was filed Monday.

"All that this type of frivolous action does is reduce the confidence of the public in the voting systems that have been carefully worked out after the 2000 election," he said. "I am absolutely stupefied that the Democratic Party could stoop to this level."

In reaction to potential voters being shut out of the 2000 presidential election, Congress passed a law allowing voters to cast provisional ballots.
